

- 1. Questions you still have


The Best Currve System for self-editing by Bradley Harper (and a touch of philosophy)

B: BORING



- Passive voice or lack of change
- The castle was captured by the Moors vs. the Moors captured the castle
- Two people arguing who never agree and they and the story are unaltered at the end of the scene. (If there is no change, why is the scene there?)

E: Efficient Word Use



- "I suppose that Henry went to the store just now to try to persuade Helen to go out with him."
- "Henry went to the store to ask Helen out."


E: Efficient Word Use cont.



- "Henry walked slowLY to the door.

S: SENSES (Vary!)

T: TELLING

C: CONFUSING

U: UNBELIEVABLE

R: REPETITION

"Henry's briefcase contained his briefing."



R: Reveal

- Make them laugh Make them cry Make them wait



V: VARY



"The sun blazed down. The soldiers were thirsty. They cheered when they found the well. They cried when they learned it was poisoned."

"The sun blazed down upon the parched troops. A cheer broke out when they sighted a well, thinking they were saved. They were wrong."

E: ENDING
