

President's Message

"There are three rules for writing a novel. Unfortunately, no one knows what they are."

#### - W. Somerset Maugham



What do you think these three rules would be? I've pondered this quote for a while and I've come up with three simple rules that affect my writing.

Rule number one -Write. You're a writer if you write. It doesn't

matter if you write a short poem, a children's book, or a four-hundred page book. It doesn't matter if you've published your words or kept them locked up in your diary. Those that pick up the pen, or open their word document and spill words in some meaningful way onto the page, are writers.

I've produced twenty Jazzy books full of words, however I often shy away from being labeled an author. "I haven't written anything without pictures in it." But when I speak to elementary school children, I realize that I am an author. I wrote poems. I wrote stories. I wrote concept prompts for pictures. I wrote, ergo, I am an author.

Rule number two - Share. Words kept alone are sacred. If that's all you wish to do, then more power to you. You are still an author but nobody is going to know you are one. The rest of us, those with goals of publishing, have to share. There are many kinds of sharing. Simple conversations with friends, family, or other writers about your characters, the plot, and your goals are helpful. Words pondered in a critique group may seem harsh, but critical feedback is important. Reading comments made by a professional editor might send you into a temper, or make you cry, but in the end, it will strengthen your story. Then, of course, once you've published your words, you have to share them with the world.

Rule number three - Cut. Take that feedback and kill your darlings. Yes, remove excess scenes, slash those pesky adverbs, take a hatchet to all those helping words. I learned about this process and I cannot unlearn it. When I read books full of "She had been's" and "I am going to think about doing something's." I often stop reading. The process is detrimental to my writing and I have to fight doing this as new words form. I have to remember, I'm in step one, not three. However, by cutting out stuff that does not move the reader to the next sentence, paragraph or page, you come closer to engaging your reader.

So there you have it. Sonja's three rules to write by. What would your three rules be?




